## Job racket busted, 2 held

Sonarapur: Two men were arrested on Wednesday for allegedly cheating several people with false promises of getting them jobs either in the state health department or in private hospitals.

Officers of Sonarapur police station, who made the arrests, said they had received multiple complaints where victims were cheated out of several lakhs of rupees in the name of getting them jobs in the health sector.

"The accused used to sign on blank pages, promising their victims that the money they paid would be refunded if the job could not be arranged. However, once the money was paid, the accused duo would snap all ties with the aspirants and stop taking their calls," said an officer of Sonarapur police station.

The two were identified as Sourav Dey and Raja Chatterjee. Dey is a resident of Sonarapur, while Chatterjee is a resident of Tollygunge. They have been remanded in police custody.

"We suspect there could be others associated with the racket. According to the complaints we have received so far, the duo used to boast about their high-level connections that they used to get jobs for anyone who approached them in private hospitals and the state health department," said the officer.

The two would sometimes show fake appointment letters on the letterhead of reputable hospitals to fool their victims, police said.

Police said they were trying to find out who else was involved in the racket.

"There is a formal procedure for recruitment in all agencies and companies. Bringing their way to get a job in a reputed hospital or the state health department may land the victim in the clutches of a cheat. Hence, we always advise people not to fall for such promises," said a senior cop of the Barurpur police directorate.

Police said they have seized the mobile phones and laptops of the accused and were trying to dig further into the racket. "We are also trying to find out if more people have been cheated similarly. The gadgets will be sent for forensic examination," a police officer said.

## Cops start case for felling Mahua tree

Patuli: Police have started a case against a man who was allegedly found chopping a Mahua tree at Patuli's Birji Purba Para on Wednesday afternoon.

Police identified the man as Subal Sardar, 60.

"The man was found chopping the tree by one of the officers of Patuli police station while he was on the rounds. The man could not give any satisfactory answer after the officer sought an explanation," said an officer of Patuli police station.

Anyone in Calcutta who wants to cut a tree must obtain a no-objection certificate from the forest department as well as from the Kolkata Municipal Corporation, said the police. In this case, the man had no such permissions.

Police started a case against the man and informed the forest department, as the offence was cognizable under sections of the West Bengal Trees (Protection and Conservation In Non-Forest Area) Act, 2006.

Sources in the forest department said cutting a tree is allowed only if the tree is found to be causing any damage to a building's structure, or the branches are dangerously getting entwined with any source of electricity and may cause an accident.

The rules also include planting multiple saplings for every tree that has to be cut down, only under specific conditions as permitted by law.

## Cops find solution to Sector V exit jam

# KMDA told to widen culvert on Bypass

Calcutta: Police have asked the Kolkata Metropolitan Development Authority (KMDA) to extend a concrete culvert on the eastern flank of EM Bypass near the Chingrighata crossing so that Science City-bound vehicles get extra road space.

Vehicles from Sector V move slowly during peak hours, mainly in the evening, while taking a left turn from Salt Lake Bypass to EM Bypass because of a lack of enough road space.

Even after taking a left turn, the vehicles cannot move properly because the road takes a turn, and the size of the carriageway there is smaller compared to other stretches of the Bypass.

As a result, on most days, the tail of vehicles reaches up to Nicco Park, leaving motorists frustrated. At a meeting held last week, senior officers of Kolkata Police urged their counterparts in the KMDA to widen the concrete culvert at Shantinagar, about 30m from Captain Bheri, by at least 3.5m.

This will accommodate more vehicles headed for Garia from the Chingrighata intersection on the Bypass, and the peak-hour congestion would be reduced significantly, the police said.

"The turn from Salt Lake Bypass to EM Bypass is critical. The buildings on the left have made it difficult to ensure a smooth left turn for the vehicles coming from Sector V and New Town," a police officer said.

"We have proposed that if the width and the length of the existing concrete culvert are increased, vehicles can reach Captain Bheri faster.

From Captain Bheri, the road flattens out and vehicles get to move at a normal speed."

Police officers managing traffic at the Chingrighata crossing said that for vehicles arriving from Sector V and New Town along Salt Lake Bypass and taking a left turn remained a challenge, particularly during peak evening hours, for several reasons:

■ The evening count of vehicles headed towards Ruby from Uladanga on EM Bypass has gone up several times in the last few years.

■ Vehicles from Uladanga towards Ruby through the Chingrighata crossing, and those coming from Salt Lake and taking a left turn onto the Bypass, cannot be merged as the road space is inadequate to hold so many vehicles.

■ There is a continuous movement of pedestrians and cyclists from Sukantanagar across the Chingrighata intersection throughout the day, and they have to be accommodated by stopping traffic.

"Several IT companies have done away with work from home, and the number of personal vehicle users has gone up since the pandemic. As a result, more private cars and two-wheelers wait to take a left turn on EM Bypass to head towards Ruby," a senior officer at Lalbazar said.

KMDA engineers said a proposal for widening the carriageway on the eastern flank of the Bypass close to Captain Bheri has been submitted for financial approval.

"It's not just about widening a culvert but increasing the road space on the Bypass. It will take several months to complete this task once approved," said a senior KMDA engineer.

## EMERGENCY DRILL AT AIRPORT



**CRISIS-READY:** A "hot fire drill" was conducted at the Calcutta airport on Thursday as part of the airport's monthly emergency preparedness routine.

A hot fire drill is a full-scale emergency simulation where multiple agencies perform their designated roles as they would in a real-life aircraft emergency, said an airport official.

Thursday's exercise, which started at

3.48pm under the direction of airport director PR Beuria, involved 16 aircraft rescue and firefighting (ARFF) personnel and nine central industrial security force personnel.

The drill utilised two ARFF vehicles and two ambulances, with a mock aircraft crash staged on the airport premises to simulate a high-pressure emergency scenario.

## Unified portal launched to clear traffic fines

Calcutta: The city and the state police, along with the transport department, have recently launched a unified e-challan portal to facilitate the collection of fines from vehicles violating traffic rules.

Developed jointly by the departments of transport and information technology and electronics, the portal has been named Sanjog.

The government has decided that unless the dues are cleared, the mandatory fitness and pollution certificates will not be issued, and any transaction involving a driving licence will not be allowed.

A recent notification issued by the state transport secretary, Saumitra Mohan, says Kolkata Police and their state counterparts, along with the transport department, will have to start using the portal from June to channelise revenue collection to respective departments.

Senior police officers said the owner of an offending vehicle will receive a text message containing details of the violation of any of the provisions under the Motor Vehicles Act 1988 immediately after being booked by the police or the transport department.

This message will have details of the e-challan and a link to the Sanjog portal.

"The owner of an offending vehicle will follow the link



to visit the Sanjog portal sent through the text message and pay the fine. The amount shall be credited directly to the state exchequer in the relevant head of account," a senior Kolkata Police officer said.

Senior transport department officers involved in creating the portal said pending challans for all the departments, including Kolkata Traffic Police, West Bengal Traffic Police and the transport department, will be available on Sanjog.

One can pay online to clear the pending challans of all three departments with a single click at [sanjog.wb.gov.in](http://sanjog.wb.gov.in), they said.

"A vehicle owner will get to know about all the traffic cases against him or her from one platform. This will help the person clear the dues with one click," said an officer of the transport department.

"That, in turn, would help the state government realise the pending revenue from offending vehicles. Earlier, several owners were not even aware of the number of cases pending against

their vehicles."

With the three departments issuing tickets for traffic violations separately, senior officers of the transport department said several crores of rupees have remained unclaimed as dues from traffic fines.

With Sanjog, each department will get to learn about their revenue incomes from the pending challans.

While the notification spells out that pollution and fitness tests won't be cleared unless owners of offending vehicles clear their pending dues, it also states that a registering authority in Calcutta and other districts may process a citizen's request for a service provided he or she ensures that the pending amount is cleared within six months.

"Someone who wants to pay road tax or register a new vehicle with pending dues will be asked to clear the amount within six months," the transport department officer said.

A section of private transport operators has asked the state government to reconsider the decision of not issuing the mandatory pollution and fitness certificates unless the pending challans are cleared.

"The fitness and pollution certificates and permits should not be held back because of the pending challans. That would be unfair to private bus and minibus operators," they said in an appeal to the state government.

## NGOs appeal to CM for stricter norms for bars

Calcutta: City-based NGOs Concern for Calcutta and Calcutta Citizens' Initiative have jointly appealed to chief minister Mamata Banerjee, requesting stricter enforcement and regulation of operating hours for bars and restaurants serving

alcohol in Calcutta. The NGOs have urged that no bar, including dance bars and restaurants with bar licence, be allowed to serve liquor beyond 11.30pm, and that no bar or liquor-serving restaurant be permitted to operate on any floor above the ground floor of any building, said Narayan Jain, spokesperson for the NGOs.
